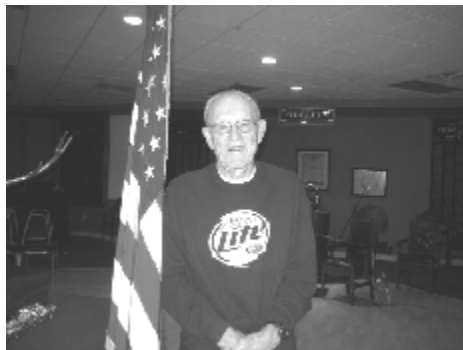

WAYNE ALLEN

Wayne enlisted in the Navy on June 18th, 1942 at San Diego. He was chosen to go to radio school at the University of Wisconsin which took four months to complete. He was sent to Norfolk VA. and served with the Amphibious Forces at Beach Bay. He was in the 1st Beach Battalion for the invasion of Sicily in 1943. He then went back to Norfolk where they reformed as the 6th Beach Battalion. He was with the 6th Beach Battalion for the Normandy invasion. After that he went to Oceanside CA. with the Communication Unit which was called the Salt Signal Company, while in the Salt Signal Co. he went to Pearl Harbor after the attack by the Japanese, he also served in the Guadalcanal where many Navy battles took place. On April 1st he was in the invasion of Okinawa, after the invasion they made miscellaneous runs to pick up troops and transport them back to rejoin their units. Wayne was discharged on the 29th of December 1945; he was out of the Navy for four months and then decided to rejoin. He served with the Navy for two more years at Great Lakes Illinois and Pensacola Florida.

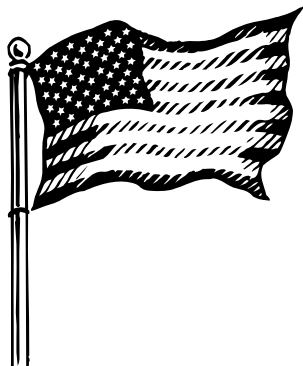

Dear Members:

Our Exalted Ruler, Don Schlegel, at the time of this production of the October 849er, is in intensive care after surgery to remove a lump on his lung. Preliminary tests indicated a benign growth, but the post surgery tests were not available as I write this today. Our prayers and best wishes are with Don, Eunice and his family. Hopefully but the time this bulletin is mailed, the prognosis will be excellent and Don will be on his way to a healthy recover.

The Lodge and its members are mourning the passing of our P.E.R. and Trustee, Vernon E. Christensen. "Chris" the Barber has been a mainstay and fixture in the lodge for many, many years and his battle against liver cancer was short and devastating. 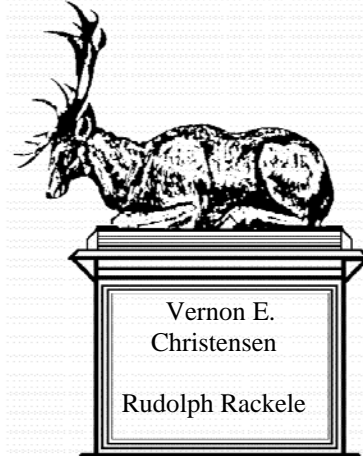

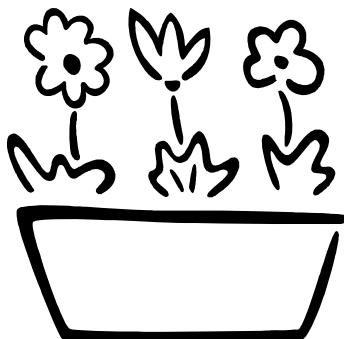

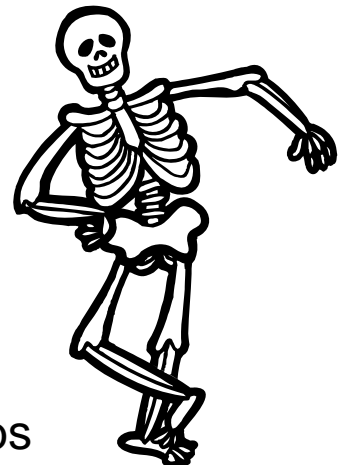
